Retreat Information:

Meals: All meals will be included in the cost. On travel days, we will make short stops for food. Hotels will have continental breakfast available, and we will have cereal and other breakfast items available at Eagle Eyrie. Lunch will be packed for our service project, otherwise we will mostly eat out. My goal when planning dining options is to offer students something they can't normally eat around Poplar Bluff!

What to pack:

- Bible, journal or notebook, writing utensil
- Appropriate clothing: If your clothes are a distraction to yourself or others, you will be asked to change. The following items are permissible to wear: anything that is discrete & proper for a Christian environment including, but not limited to, shorts, jeans, khaki/dress pants, t-shirts, polo & button down shirts.
- Comfortable clothing/footwear: This will be a very active trip. Please pack tennis shoes for hiking and the service project. Snowflex recommends comfortable long sleeves and sweat pants during skiing to avoid rug-burn. Longer clothing should be light since this will be summer (no snow is actually involved in skiing.)
- Swimwear: Hotels may offer a pool, but swimming is not guaranteed. If a pool is available, swimsuits must be a one piece or tankini that join, or a dark colored t-shirt over a two piece.
- Bedding: Lodging at Eagle Eyrie is dorm style. Please bring sheets (or sleeping bag), blankets, pillows, and towels.
- Toiletries and all other essentials for a week away from home.

Rules:

1. Be present and on time for every event and departure.
2. Absolutely no PDA! The guys' rooms are off limits to the girls and the girls' rooms are off limits to the guys. No one is allowed in the rooms alone, unless sick and have approval from a leader. Also, no relationship will start or end throughout the duration of the trip.
3. Dress code: See info above on clothing and swimwear.
4. Absolutely no alcohol. Tobacco, or pills (unless authorized by parents as medicine) allowed.
5. Please, no practical jokes.
6. The FBCPB group is your family for the weekend. Anyone desiring to break off from the group must have approval from a leader. You must stay in a group of 3 or more at all times. Please remember your actions represent FBCPB and Christ.
7. You alone are responsible for your actions during the trip. Remember you are accountable to God, the staff and leaders. If a problem arises we will contact your parents to make arrangements toward a resolution. Do your best to include others and make new friends.
